IV. Discussion/Action Agenda

A. National Easterseals Letter of Support

- Steve Workman presented a request from Judy Shanley, VP of Transportation at Easterseals National and codirector of the National Center for Mobility Management to support National Easterseals proposal to lead a new FTA funded technical assistance center. NCMM is currently uder the co-direction of CTAA and Easterseals (National). Judy and Easterseals have been involved in this work for over a decade. Judy has been a longtime resource to NH community transportation and helped us to shape recent innovations and connected our state work to FTA.
- Background: The FTA funded National Center for Mobility Management will sunset at the end of December 2024. FTA is replacing it with a new technical assistance center that will include CCAM and Mobility Management. A competitive bid process has been launched by FTA and closes August 30, 2024. This requested letter of support is for the proposal National Easterseals as lead agency will submit in collaboration with National R-TAP, SUMC, NADTC and a variety of consultants.
- Steve Workman reminded that he is an independent consultant working for NCMM at Easterseals with Judy as his supervisor and advised that his work would continue if this proposal is selected. He further advised that he will recuse himself from this vote because he has a financial interest in the Easterseals proposal. He said he was willing to answer any questions and/or to leave the room if the membership felt it needed to discuss and vote in his absence.
- Group discussion: Steve responded to several clarifying questions and committed to asking Judy for details
 about the grant that should be included in the LOS and for any key points or NH experiences that she would



like to see us included. Steve will provide this information to the Chair to provide a letter in support and will continue his recusal by not participating in the development or delivery of the LOS. Chuck, Deb and Gene will draft the letter with info provided by Judy. SCC will review a copy of the letter at its September meeting. Steve was not asked to leave the room during discussion and the vote.

B. NHDOT Updates (Shelley & Cathy)

1. SCC Council Appointments - Shelley Winters

- The terms have expired for all SCC voting members appointed by the Governor and Executive Council. These positions need to be filled through re-appointment or new appointments as soon as possible with the governor requesting that all state councils, etc. are appropriately filed before the end of his term. There are eight (8) open seats to fill. Shelley also conveyed some concerns from the field that some part of NH are underrepresented on the SCC and suggested that might be something to include in strategies for filling
- Deb and the Governance Committee will assist Rad vetting and recommending potential candidates. A
 partial list of candidates is expected to be on the September SCC Agenda. Steve will send Shelley his
 nomination packet used when he was originally appointed.

2. General Updates (Cathy Cormier)

- Cathy shared that the Keep NH Moving website is great and she is using it frequently.
- FY26-27 FTA 5310 RCA Regional Distribution funding is going out in the fall/winter. By spring 2025, RCC leads need to submit their applications for funds. NHDOT will distribute the money (They will be using 2020 Census data). The amount of money per region won't increase, but Cathy's not sure if it includes the newest 10%. Does the SCC have recommendations on how to distribute the money, including should lane



miles or square miles be factored into the decision? The funds are normally distributed based on communities with seniors with disabilities, but the DOT may consider other factors to find a more balanced approach. Depending on how it's distributed, it may adversely impact specific programs.

Discussion:

- Rad suggests the SCC form a subcommittee for this and/or planning for possible funding scenarios.
- The funding discussion has SCC members concerned about the future of the Mobility Management Network and funding the mobility managers. Without funding, Regions 1 and 2 could lose their mobility managers. Teri Palmer says currently the network is not part of an entity, it just exists and to get funding, it needs to be part of something or potentially restructured. Possible funding source suggestions from SCC members include: DHHS, CMAC, braided funding and there may be an AARP grant opportunity through Jeff Donald (\$50K for three years). Steve adds that we need to show data (including any data from the Statewide Needs Assessment that's coming in early, prior to full results in 2026) to the appropriate parties to secure funding. Chuck suggests correspondence from Fred Butler on this for the SCC Leadership to review.
- Teri Palmer can work with Fred Butler to survey the Mobility Managers to see where they stand financially.
- Cathy will ask about the \$1.2M flex funds that Steve reminded was supposed to be for the Mobility Management Network.

C. SCC Mobility Management Network Updates

1. State Mobility Manager Report (Teri):

- Teri met with Steve and Fred in July to review the Performance Measures spreadsheet. (PM 1 new ridership, PM 2 is referrals and PM 8 is meetings and outreach). Teri has worked with the Mobility managers to better define the distinction between meetings and outreach for the specific PMs. Teri needs approval on these definitions to update the PMs.
- Mobility Managers who have not turned in workplans, are getting those together. Also, some providers
 are not submitting info for the spreadsheet. Teri has informed SCC leadership/Fred Butler and they will
 hold these folks accountable.
- We may post Ben's video on the website.
- Teri will email Chuck any items for SCC leadership to review, including PM definitions and asking SCC leadership to define their goals for the Mobility Managers moving forward. SCC leadership will provide info by the September meeting.

2. Employment status of Mobility Managers (FT/PT/Other)

• At this time, Regions 1 & 2 are partially funded, and that funding will likely be expended by end of Fall 2024. Tri-County CAP continues to umbrella both mobility managers, but requires more funding for these positions. Members expressed concern that we are learning about this shortfall in August and that we are in danger of losing those two mobility managers. SCC Leadership, North Country folks and NHDOT will be looking closer at these issues to determine how to best proceed.

D. Keep NH Moving Website (Steve)

 Steve reported ongoing updates to the site including events, SCC members and officers, added partners and have received significant user feedback.



• Steve has conducted successful website training sessions with health care and workforce personnel, including how coordination works, the value of the Mobility Management Network and how to use the site. When presenting, Steve is clear with audiences that this is the first step in securing a ride and is a first step for the state to have such a tool. He said we should acknowledge upfront that this site will require constant updating and improvement and that larger goals like a single call/click to book a ride anywhere in the state is something that will take years and money.

E. SCC Fiscal Year 24-25 - TABLED

The Chair tabled Agenda Item E.1-4 because of the lengthy discussions about funding formula changes and the mobility management funding concerns. Chuck believed the SCC Leadership was going to require more time to prepare information and suggestions for discussion at regular meetings. These items will appear on forthcoming agendas as they are ready.

F. Governance Committee: Regional Bylaws Adoption Update - Deb Ritcey

• Deb is waiting for a couple RCCs to submit their recently approved bylaws. She will have a full report at the September meeting.

G. SCC Strategic Workgroup Updates - Not already on the agenda

1. Sustainability (Ellen)

Committee is restarting meetings after the summer recess.

2. SCC Annual Report (Teri)

- The annual report is due Nov. 1 to Governor and Executive Council. The current one the workgroup is drafting covers the last three years. SCC leadership will receive a draft when ready.
